



LASD Homicide Investigation of a Death Investigation
6300 Block of Slauson Avenue, Culver City

On January 13th, 2021 at approximately 2:30 AM, Culver City Police Dispatch received two separate calls regarding a subject walking in a neighborhood and screaming for help in the area of Sepulveda Boulevard and Jefferson Boulevard.

Additionally, the reporting parties stated that the subject was dressed in only his underwear and was bleeding. While officers were en route, they received an additional call that the subject was now at a business located at 6300 Slauson Avenue, banging on the locked doors and attempting to enter the business.

Officers arrived on the scene and contacted the subject, who was only dressed in his underwear, had a significant amount of blood on his body, and was making incoherent statements. Officers believed the subject was under the influence of a controlled substance and in need of medical attention. They were able to detain and handcuff the subject. While awaiting the Culver City Fire Department's arrival, the subject began to resist the officers as the Fire Department arrived on the scene.

The officers continued to restrain the subject, and at some point, he became unresponsive. Culver City Fire Department personnel immediately rendered medical aid and transported the subject to a local hospital. The man died on January 16th, 2021.

The Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department Homicide Bureau is conducting the death investigation at the request of the Culver City Police Department. The Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office Has been notified and is monitoring.

The Los Angeles County Department of Medical Examiner-Coroner will determined the cause of death. Additional information will be disseminated when it's available.
